Required Text: Leadership: Theory and practice, 5th edition. By Northouse (Sage, 2010).

Course Description: This course develops leadership knowledge and skills with emphasis on both understanding and application. It will integrate problem solving, communication, decision-making, motivation, and ethics.

Course Objectives: To develop the student's ability to critically observe and evaluate diverse organizational leadership situations, use modern behavioral science theories and approaches to identify what is happening in an organization, account for those occurrences, formulate potential leadership actions, and professionally present ideas.

Course Updates: Changes to the syllabus will be announced in class and updated on Blackboard. The student is ultimately responsible for keeping up to date with such changes.

Course Requirements and Grading:

- a) Examinations: There will be four scheduled exams, each accounting for 17.5% of the final grade. Exams will consist of multiple choice questions, true/false questions, and short fill-in responses. All topics covered in class may appear on the exam including those not contained in the text (handouts, discussions). Material found in the text but not covered in class may also appear on the exams unless specifically omitted by the instructor.
- b) Quizzes: There will be numerous unannounced quizzes (short fill-in responses) on the reading assignments (chapters). The quizzes in total will represent 10% of the final grade.
- c) Individual Projects: Each student will choose, with instructor approval, a leader to become personally familiar with during the semester. The student will prepare a detailed one-sheet handout on that leader and present a detailed presentation in class (approximately 5 minutes, dependent on class size). This will represent 10% of the final grade.
- d) Attendance, participation, evaluation: Each student will review their fellow students' leader presentations. This activity will represent 10% of the total grade.
